The couple met at the [University of Cambridge](#) in England, from which the bride received a master's degree in philosophy.

The bride, 30, is keeping her name. She is a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Scholar in Health Policy Research at Harvard, where she is studying childhood competition and culture. She graduated magna cum laude from Harvard and received a Ph.D. in sociology from Princeton.

She is the daughter of Pamela Eldred-Robbins of West Bloomfield, Mich., and Dr. Jules F. Levey of Scottsdale, Ariz. Her father is a general surgeon in private practice in Scottsdale. Her mother was Miss America 1970. The bride is the stepdaughter of Norman Robbins, a retired lawyer in West Bloomfield.

The bridegroom, 29, is an assistant professor of public policy at Harvard, where he teaches taxation and health policy. He graduated summa cum laude from Harvard, from which he also received a master's degree in statistics and a Ph.D. in economics.

He is a son of Barbara C. Friedman and Benjamin M. Friedman of Cambridge, Mass. His mother works in Boston as a senior personal trust manager for TIAA-CREF, the money management company. His father is a professor of political economy at Harvard.
